| 授業の目標 Course Objectives | In this course, students collaborate in team to propose innovative and feasible solutions to given problems, taking advantage of member's expertise. They conduct explore the context and root cause of the problem, refer to existing data from similar case studies, synthesize a variety of ideas and approaches from different fields of study into solutions. Students make the solution feasible through consideration of the business plan etc, and present project outcomes to potential stakeholders. | | |
| 到達目標 Course Goals | By completing this course, students will be able to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Organize and manage team for productive collaboration (clarification and fulfillment of given roles); ● Propose evidence-based solutions to given problems with reference to data from similar case studies; ● Design the research process and methods, and allocate available resources toward solutions; ● Make well-structured and cogent presentation of project outcomes; ● Understand what entrepreneurship is. | | |
| 授業計画 Course Schedule | This course adopts as problems that students address broad and interdisciplinary social issues, such as Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Instructors give short lectures on a methodology as necessary to approach the issues. Students engage in team project for problem solving. 【Project】 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students are given problems to address and solve from Nitobe College instructors and/or guest lecturers (who are usually experts in the thematic fields); ● Students are expected to propose innovative and feasible solutions to given problems, collecting and analyzing suitable data and taking advantage of strengths of different approaches from distinct fields of study; ● Students overview the given problem and clarify the tasks to achieve solutions to set a schedule toward the final presentation which is held in the final session. Using the knowledge and tools of project management such as Work Breakdown Structure (WBS), Gantt chart, role assignment and risk management, the project proposal is created to get the overview of the process. Students are expected to adopt a suitable method from social survey including interview and questionnaire to implement their research process. ● Students conduct the research project according to the plan. They are required to contribute to teamwork by searching reference, making a resume or any contributions outside of the class if s/he does not engage in-class discussion. The research materials and progress of the project are logged and shared within the team using Nitobe Portfolio (NPF) system. | | |

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students consider how the proposed solution can be made into a feasible project and returned to society through consideration of business plans, etc. As necessary, we invite lecturers from inside and outside Hokkaido University to give lectures on entrepreneurship and how to start up a company. |
| <p>【Presentations】</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students present their survey results and conclusions for a given task. They consider the contents of the presentation and slide design, and then practice for compelling presentations. Students will explain the conclusions reached by the team in order and aim for a presentation that is easy for the audience to understand. ● As part of the Nitobe College’s educational goal of knowledge sharing and application for social benefit, in this course, presentations are basically open to the public as well as the stakeholders. |
| <p>【Review & Reflection】</p> <p>Students reflect on what learned and not learned through this course and review their research process and conclusion to consider how much the obtained solution can solve the problem, what are remained as unsolved problems, and what can be found as new problems. Furthermore, they are expected to think what can be shared as social benefits or values associated with the solution.</p> |
| <p>準備学習 (予習・復習)等の内容と分量 Homework</p> <p>Students are required to record learning progress on Nitobe Logbook, while to submit their self-evaluation and comments regarding the class contents to NPF.</p> |
| <p>成績評価の基準と方法 Grading System</p> <p>Student’s performance is evaluated based on their active engagement in in-class assignments and contribution to teamwork, oral presentation, application of Nitobe Logbook and NPF, and Term Self-assessment Report, which is required to turn in at the end of the term with purpose of reflecting learning progress and reviewing future learning goals.
